### **Basic and Continuing Ceramics with Daria**

Instructor: Daria Kim

Wednesdays, June 29 to August 4, from 6:30pm to 9:00pm

Geared for beginners and those looking to expand their skills. In this class students will learn both basic techniques of wheelthrowing, hand building, slip/glaze/stain/wash/terra-sigilata application, and the power of form. Tuition fees include 24 hours total of out-of-class time during Independent Studio hours, 25 pounds of stoneware clay and all firing, slips and glazes. New students will need to purchase a basic pottery tool kit available for \$20 at the first class.



#### Advanced Ceramics with Daria

Mondays, June 27 to August 22, from 6:30pm to 9:00pm

This 8 week course is for students who are comfortable with the basics and want to continue their development in wheel-throwing, handbuilding and glazing techniques. Explore new ways of combining thrown and hand built forms, and experiment with different materials. Experienced students may work at their own pace with individual assignments. Tuition fees include 24 hours total of out-of-class time during Independent Studio hours, 25 pounds of stoneware clay and all firing, slips and glazes.



### Wheelthrowing 101

Thursdays, June 30 to August 25, from 6:30 to 9:00 pm

This 8 week course is a great introduction to the exciting process of wheel thrown ceramics. Developed for students with little or no clay experience, the class covers basic skills at the potter's wheel for creating functional work. Demonstrations will cover wedging, centering, and forming shapes such as vases, mugs, bowls and plates. Learn basic decorating and glazing techniques and get an introduction to kiln firing.



#### **Functional Handbuilding with Clay**

Tuesdays, June 28 to August 16, from 6:30 to 9:00 pm

This introductory class will present students with easy-to-make options for building cups, bowls and plates using handbuilding techniques. No experience is necessary to achieve fantastic results! Tuition fees includes 24 hours total of out-of-class time during Independent Studio hours, 25 pounds of stoneware clay and all firing, slips and glazes. New students need to purchase a handbuilding tool kit available for \$20 at the first class.




### **Independent Studio: Ceramics 24 Hour Pass**

Pass is good for 24 total hours. You will be notified when you have exceeded your hours. If you have taken at least two Art Center ceramic courses in the past two years (OR have previous clay experience and attended at least one class at the Art Center in the last 2 years), you can work independently in the Art Center ceramic studios during set hours. Wheel use is not guaranteed and instruction is not provided.



## **Beginning Jewelry & Metalsmithing**

Wednesdays, June 29 to August 24, from 6:30 to 9:00 pm

This class geared towards beginners will emphasize the design concepts and basic metalsmithing techniques used to create metal jewelry. Students with previous experience may also join to refine techniques and develop personal style. Bring a sketchbook and pencil to the first class. The lab fee includes 24 hours of Independent Studio time outside of class. Jewelry kits that include needed materials and tools will be available for purchase the first day of class.



### Jewelry & Metalsmithing II

Thursdays, June 30 to August 25, from 6:30pm – 9:00pm

This 8 week class will emphasize refining design concepts and will introduce advanced techniques used to create metal jewelry. This class is for students who already have taken a course in basic metalsmithing. Tuition includes 24 hours of Jewelry Independent Studio time outside of class. Additional materials may need to be purchased.




#### Pearl Carving

Saturday, August 6, from 10:00 am to 5:00 pm

Join jewelry artist Betsy Lehndorff for this unique class focused on carving pearls. Students will learn a variety of pearl carving techniques focused on embracing a pearl's natural flaws and creating beautiful one-of-a-kind works of wearable art. Each student will leave with 3 carved pearls and a piece of silver ballchain to create a necklace. All materials will be provided. Experience with a dremel tool or foredom is recommended for this class. There will be an hour break for lunch. You are welcome to bring your own or enjoy the many wonderful restaurants that surround the Art Center in the heart of downtown Ann Arbor. \*Discounts and volunteer coupons do not apply for this class.



#### Beginning Drawing

Thursdays, June 30 to August 25, from 6:30 pm to 9:00 pm

In this course students will learn the basic skills needed to make realistic drawings as they practice accurately rendering shapes, and learn how to see light and shadow. There will be many demonstrations and discussions, as well as individual and group instruction. This class is intended for people who have little or no experience drawing so there is no need to be nervous!



## 4 Day Basics of Drawing

This four day class will introduce students to the elements of drawing. Learn about the basics of drawing including material exploration, handeye coordination, light/shadow, perspective, and more. This crash course is perfect for those who have no experience in art or are looking to brush up on their drawing skills.



## **Exploring the Portrait**

This class is geared towards students with past drawing experience looking to begin exploring the genre of the portrait. Students will work from live models and engage with concepts of facial structure and composition. Students are encouraged to bring their drawing medium of choice to the first class where additional materials will be discussed.



## **Contemporary Pastels**

In this class geared towards beginners students will explore the versatile medium of soft pastels. Students will complete four different projects using soft pastels and learn a variety of techniques. Absolutely no experience is necessary!



## 4 Day Basics of Colored Pencils

This four day class is an introduction to using colored pencils to create drawings from life. Students will learn a variety of colored pencil techniques such as layering, hatching and cross-hatching, burnishing and embossing techniques. Students will also explore color theory and will complete color mixing exercises. Absolutely no experience is necessary!



## Abstract Landscapes

Wednesdays, June 29 to August 24, from 1:00 to 3:30 pm

Using the landscape as a point of reference this class will explore compositional and visual languages that venture into abstraction. Students will develop their own vocabulary of mark making along with the tools of non-representational painting traditions. This classis a best fit for those with some previous painting or drawing experience who are excited to investigate landscapes in a new way! - Students will make paintings and preparatory drawings from sites both chosen by them as well as the instructor. - While this class will focus primarily on the use of painting with oil or acrylic paint, students will be encouraged to work with mixed media as well.



#### Art in the Botanical Gardens

Wednesdays, June 29 to August 24, from 10:30 am to 1:00 pm

Learn to beautifully capture the plants, flowers, and landscape in one of Ann Arbor's premier gardens this spring. Students will work in the medium of their choice for eight weeks on location at Matthaei Botanical Gardens. Emphasis is placed on learning to simplify your compositions while organizing form, value, and color. Learn tips to strengthen your work all while enjoying the abundance of color. Class will meet indoors in case of inclement weather. Students should bring their preferred medium, supplies, and a portable easel. Please note that all day parking at the Botanical Gardens is \$5, so we've reduced the cost of the class to cover students' out of pocket expense.



#### **Basics of Acrylic Painting**

Mondays, July 11 to August 29, from 6:30 pm - 9:00pm

This class is designed for individuals who are new to acrylic painting but are interested in learning the foundations and improving their skill. You will begin by learning about tone, shades, color mixing, and acrylic painting techniques. Throughout the course you will complete projects that will enhance your understanding of the process of acrylic painting. Students will complete a still life project, using paint to define an object's color in relation to other objects. We will also do a Georgia O'Keeffe-inspired painting, painting close-up compositions that take note of fine details. In addition, the class will learn how to paint a landscape using acrylic paint.



### **Meditative Painting at White Lotus Farms**

Monday, August 8 to Thursday August 11, from 10:00 am to 12:30 pm

In this four day intensive, students will work on location at the beautiful White Lotus Farms in west Ann Arbor. This class will cover how to work with acrylic paints and then engage a series of exercises involving breath, body and mind relaxation. Working in the contemplative gardens at White Lotus Farms will provide a lush and tranquil setting to practice basic meditation and calming the mind in order to delve into and connect with a deeper wealth of creative potency and expressive capacity. We will work on paper and also make a mandala design on canvas or board to work with color mixtures.



### 4 Day Alternative Methods in Printmaking

This course will explore alternative printmaking and photo processes. Several techniques will be covered in this fun four day class. Absolutely no experience is necessary and all levels of students are welcome.



#### **Introduction to Encaustic Painting**

Encaustic is the ancient art of painting with a combination of beeswax, damar resin and colored pigments. The mixture is applied hot and each layer of wax is fused with heat to create a single bonded surface that is full of luscious color and depth. This introductory level class will cover safe studio practices, surface preparation, materials, texture and transfers. Through demonstration and work time, participants will fully explore this medium.



## **Continuing Encaustic Painting**




#### 4 Day Shadow Box Design

No previous art experience required! Come to the first class with a pencil, a sketchbook, and any art supplies that you would like to use, as well as any 2-D and 3-D items to fill the box with. You may bring a self-made or purchased shadow box to the first class meeting or wait until the second meeting, to choose your box.



## Basics of Italic Calligraphy

Join guest calligrapher Julie Wildman and learn the basics of traditional italic calligraphy. Absolutely no experience is required and all materials will be provided. From there you will move into writing sentences, learning about proper letter and word spacing along the way. At the end of the class you will come away with a strong, working knowledge of the Italic form.




#### **Digital Painting (Adults)**




### **Teen Graphic Novel Publishing**
