Since 1909 the A2AC has been sparking creativity in people of all ages and artistic abilities. The A2AC is a 501(c)3 non-profit organization. Our mission is to be a contemporary forum for the visual arts through education, exploration, collaboration, and exhibition.

The A2AC is seeking knowledgeable and experienced ceramic artists to lead classes in wheel throwing and handbuilding for our Summer Term, which runs from Monday, June 23rd to Sunday, August 17th (with select classes starting as early as Saturday, June 21st and ending as late as Saturday, August 23rd).

Instructors are independent contractors and are paid for in-class teaching hours. All classes are in-person and on-site. The successful applicant values being part of a welcoming arts community, is an experienced ceramics instructor, and loves helping students develop their artistic skills and find a place for creativity in their lives.

We will accept applications for all skills and interests, but are currently seeking Instructors for Adult Classes in the following areas:

- Ceramics: Wheel Throwing (beginning and advanced)
- Ceramics: Handbuilding (beginning, advanced, or specialized areas of interest)

Schedule

Most instructors teach on average anywhere between 1 - 3 classes per term.

Each adult class typically meets once a week for 2.5 hours for either 4 or 8 weeks.

Each youth class typically meets once a week for 1.5-2 hours for either 4 or 8 weeks.

Class scheduling is based on the applicant's availability and A2AC scheduling needs.

Art Instructor Duties

- Provide a safe, positive, creative environment for students to learn in
- Communicate with the Education Director and other Education Department staff members to provide class details for marketing purposes and other needs related to facilitating the class.

- Lead highly engaging art lessons, provide instructions, demos, and assistance as needed
- Facilitate discussions and critiques
- Set-up for class
- Follow all studio clean-up procedures and facilitate the clean-up process for students
- Respond to the individual needs and artistic goals of students
- **This position may require significant physical exertion to set-up for classes and organize supplies.** Applicants must be able to perform general physical activities that require considerable use of arms and legs and moving the whole body such as lifting, walking, going up and down stairs, setting up folding tables, stooping and handling of materials that weigh between 25-50lbs.

Required Skills & Experience

- A mastery of the visual art medium or topic the applicant is interested in teaching
- Prior teaching experience, preferably with the age group the applicant is interested in teaching
- The ability to translate complex concepts into an understandable, and engaging format
- An interest in working with primarily beginner students
- Ability to coach and provide feedback to students in a thoughtful, constructive manner
- Welcoming, approachable, positive, and patient demeanor
- Impeccable punctuality and attendance
- Excellent organization skills.
- Communicative and responds to questions and communications in a timely manner.
- Must be 18 years or older to apply
